The Board discussed a new solar law that the Town Planning Board had suggested. Councilman Busler stated that there are a lot of things about it that are terrible, including space needed, setbacks and no large-scale projects in the CAR District. Councilman Ryder questioned if solar could be in the business corridor. The Board would like to invite Daren Morgan, Planning Board Chairman, to the next meeting and go over changing some of the proposed law.
